***** Day 1: Gratitude for the Jubilee Year (December 18)

Scripture: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits." Psalm 103:2

Reflection: What grace from this Jubilee year am I most thankful for?

Prayer: Lord of Mercy, we thank You for this Jubilee Year — for every grace poured out, every heart renewed,

every soul reconciled. May our gratitude overflow into joyful witness. Amen.
